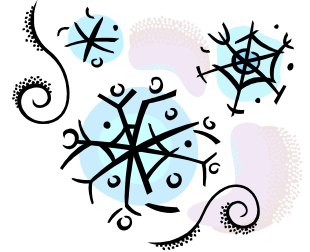

WINTER SNOW PLOWING

It's that time of year again when Mother Nature can be unpredictable. Our snow removal policy is as follows: After one inch of snow accumulates, please note that no parking is allowed on any Village street until snow removal has been completed. Also no plowing, snow blowing, or shoveling of snow onto Village streets is permitted.

Unfortunately, mailboxes occasionally are knocked over by the heavy snow pushed by the snowplows. If mailboxes are too close to the road edge, it is difficult to remove snow from the full width of the street. Please follow U.S. Postal guidelines for the placement of your mailbox.

We do receive complaints of snow being pushed in driveways during snowstorms, so we ask you to wait until the shoulders are pushed back before shoveling driveways. On cul-de-sacs we will make one pass with the plows, then finish the clean-up at the end of the storm. We do contract out some of our subdivisions to private companies for snow removal, but as always, any questions or concerns will be handled by Public Works Department at 847-395-1881. We thank you for your cooperation, and hope you have a safe winter season.

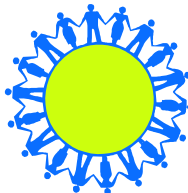
