VILLAGE OF ANTIOCH BOARD OF TRUSTEES; REGULAR MEETING Municipal Building: 874 Main Street, Antioch, IL June 6, 2011

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hanson called the June 6, 2011 regular meeting before the Board of Trustees to order at 7:30 p.m. in the Antioch Municipal Building: 874 Main Street, Antioch, Illinois.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Hanson and the Village Board of Trustees led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. ROLL CALL

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call indicated the following Trustees were present: Pierce, Sakas, Poulos, Crosby, Dominiak and Jozwiak. Also present were Mayor Hanson, Administrator Keim, Attorney Long and Clerk Rowe.

IV. MAYORAL REPORT

Mayor Hanson announced that Father Hanley passed away on June 1, 2011 after a long illness. Father Hanley was assistant pastor at Antioch's St. Peter Church from 1960-1966 and served as Pastor from 1981-1997 when he retired Pastor Emeritus. Mayor Hanson said that Father Hanley was a great person and that he will be missed.

- **1. Certificate of Appreciation to Antioch Upper Grade School Students –** Mayor Hanson presented a Certificate of Appreciation to students from the Antioch Upper Grade School 7th Grade Gold Team. The 7th Grade Gold Team helped with the Village of Antioch 2011 Beautification Event that was held on Thursday, May 19, 2011.
- 2. Jason Treat WWTP Operator of the Year Award Administrator Keim introduced Waste Water Treatment Plant Operator Jason Treat who was recently received the 2011 Central States Water Environment Association (CSWEA) Illinois Section Operations Award. Mayor Hanson and Board members congratulated Jason on his achievement. Mayor Hanson said that Jason is a terrific and dedicated employee and we are very proud of him. Administrator Keim presented Jason with a framed copy of the recently published news article regarding the CSWEA award.
- 3. Appoint William Martino to the Antioch Park Commission, replacing Wanda Utter Trustee Pierce moved, seconded by Trustee Crosby to confirm the Mayor's appoint of William Martino to the Antioch Park Commission, replacing Wanda Utter and with a term expiring 2012. Upon roll call, the vote was:

YES: 6: Pierce, Sakas, Poulos, Crosby, Dominiak and Jozwiak.

4. Sprenger Park OSLAD Grant Approval – Administrator Keim reviewed the letter dated May 25, 2011 from the IDNR approving the OSLAD Grant for Sprenger Park in the amount of \$283,200. He explained the Village was awarded the OSLAD grant, in part, due to the uniqueness of the plan. He said the park will amenities such as baseball diamond, basketball court, and a fishing pier. Administrator Keim discussed the meeting that was held earlier in the year when the Village of Antioch was one of 50 communities who were invited to Springfield to make a presentation regarding their grant application. He said that he hopes to be building the park in the very near future.

V. CITIZENS WISHING TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

Will Martino, Ashlyn Lane resident and on behalf of the NeuHaven subdivision residents, thanked Mayor Hanson, Board of Trustees and staff for their efforts regarding Sprenger Park. He also discussed conversations he had with Mayor Hanson and the promise to look at every opportunity to help with the completion of the park. He said the residents are very excited about the progress made regarding the park.

Trustee Crosby said that Will Martino also worked very hard on the park. He explained that the park will serve residents on the east side, not only those residents in the NeuHaven subdivision. Trustee Crosby said that Will Martino will be a terrific asset to the Park Commission.

Steve Chait of Steve Auto Sales, who used to be next door to Mr. G's restaurant on Main Street and North Avenue, was issued an eviction notice after he received verbal approval to move his business to 471 Main Street. He said the landowner was given a notice of violation his type of business was not allowed in M1 zoning. He said that he has been an automobile dealer for over 10 years in Antioch and 20 years in Lake County. The landowner, Mr. Bond notified him that he would be fined if he didn't move his business and he asked the Board why they would want to take away his livelihood. Trustee Sakas explained that the proper board to address this would be the Zoning Board of Appeals. Director Nilsen

said that he met with the property owner regarding the M1 zoning and that the Village did not issue an eviction notice. Following some discussion, Attorney Bob Long said that it sounds like it was done in an informative way and presented options. He suggested that Mr. Chait speak with Mr. Bond and his attorney and have them possibly contact him. He said that he would be happy to help to see if there is a solution. He further explained that the Village cannot evict; but the landlord may be able to do so. Mr. Chait will speak to his landlord Mr. Bond.

James Parks, Mystic Cove resident, said that it was his pleasure working for the Village of Antioch for almost two years. He discussed the recent grant award the important work being done by our lobbyist and said they had a lot to do with the Antioch getting the OSLAD award.

VII. REGULAR BUSINESS

13. Consideration of a Resolution authorizing the use of NeuHaven Surety Bond Proceeds for Sprenger Park Engineering; Resolution No. 11-50 – Mayor Hanson asked Board members to move this item up on the agenda for consideration. The Board agreed to discuss this item first under regular business. Administrator Keim said that due to the Neumann Homes Bankruptcy there were large areas of incomplete development in the NeuHaven Subdivision. He said the Village of Antioch completed a substantial part of the incomplete development and that we have been awarded an OSLAD grant in order to help complete Sprenger Park. The grant award is \$283,000 or about 50% of the project cost. In order to have the fields playable in 2012 construction would need to occur this season. He said that HR Green was the firm selected to design the park and apply for the OSLAD grant and staff recommends they finalize the plans and engineering and prepare the construction documents.

Board members discussed the funding and Administrator Keim said that it was a matching grant; we would fund the entire project and be reimbursed for half without any use of taxpayer funds.

Tim Hartnett of HR Green said that it was a team effort getting the grant application submitted in a short time frame and we hope to quickly jump on board to prepare bid documents so the fields can be seeded in September. He also discussed the amenities, such as pavilion, dock, piers and playground equipment that would be included in the next bid package. He said the timeline is very tight so we have to move forward as soon as possible.

Trustee Dominiak moved, seconded by Trustee Jozwiak to approve as presented **Resolution No. 11-50** authorizing the use of NeuHaven Surety Bond proceeds for Sprenger Park engineering.

Consideration of a Resolution accepting the bids received for six (6) 2011 Chevrolet Caprices and two (2) Chevrolet Tahoe's PPV with Kerr Equipment Package and Extended Warranty with Accessories per Specification and awarding bid to the responsible low bidder, Raymond Chevrolet of Antioch, Illinois; Resolution No. 11-49 – Trustee Crosby moved, seconded by Trustee Pierce to approve as presented Resolution No. 11-49 Accepting the Bids Received for Six (6) 2011 Chevrolet Caprices and Two (2) Chevrolet Tahoe's with Equipment and Warranty as Described and Awarding the Bid to the Responsible Low Bidder, Raymond Chevrolet of Antioch, Illinois.

Trustee Pierce questioned if the vehicles would be leased or purchased? Police Chief Somerville said that staff research showed that it made sense to lease the equipment. At the end of the four year lease, the equipment could be purchased for \$1. He said that we now have a vehicle program in place and that in previous years, the warranty miles were finished in the first year. Chief Somerville said the maintenance program would cost \$800 per vehicle each year and covers all items including tires, wipers, etc. Administrator Keim said once the vehicles are ordered, they would be delivered in about eight weeks. He also said that we have an opportunity to shop other lease options. Board members discussed safety concerns and costs for maintaining older vehicles.

12. Consideration of the Planning and Zoning Board Recommendation to Approve a Special Use Request Granting a Liquor License and 23 Arcade Devices for PZB 11-02, with the Conditions Included Within the Chairman's Letter of Recommendation – Mayor Hanson explained this is not a hearing, the PZB hearings were the opportunity for public comment. He asked if anyone would like to represent the group to not duplicate comments.

Director Nilsen reviewed the request and said the property is currently zoned B1. Two requests, one being over 10 devices and they are requesting 23 arcade devices. The second part of the request was the liquor and both were positively recommended by the PZB. He said Board members had an opportunity to participate in the walk through at Club Energy prior to tonight's meeting and he reviewed the Planning and Zoning Board's letter of recommendation and conditions as outlined in the letter dated April 8, 2011. At this time, there is no liquor license available and it is the sole purview of this board regarding the liquor license.

Petitioner Peter Georgiades said Club Energy would be a family dance center and banquet facilities. He said they have made Friday and Saturday night non-alcoholic nights and they would hold a family dance day one Saturday or Sunday of the month. Mr. Georgiades also discussed plans for senior programs, dance programs, and the alcohol being removed and secured during minor dance parties. He also discussed the building security and camera systems.

Board members asked Mr. Georgiades if the monthly residential meetings have begun. Mr. Georgiades responded they have and that he held an open house at the building, reviewed his business plan, and they will continue to meet on a monthly basis.

Board members discussed teen nights and how they would be scheduled over banquets. Mr. Georgiades said the teen nights would be cancelled if they have a booked reserved party such as a wedding or other private party. Concerns that were discussed by members of the Board were public safety, traffic and noise concerns and the effect on the nearby residential area. Other concerns discussed were the parking, the business plan morphing into a full time alcohol related business and the liquor license going with the property if ever sold.

There was a discussion regarding the number of required parking spaces and the drawings meeting the ordinance criteria. Board members also discussed security, traffic plans and crowd control with Mr. Georgiades responding that they intend to sell tickets prior to the events in order to control crowds. There was also a discussion regarding the additional work load on police and the surrounding neighborhood being in Lake County jurisdiction. Board members asked Attorney Long if the liquor license were granted, can it be rescinded. Attorney Long explained the state liquor code and any decision made by the liquor commissioner being reviewed by the state liquor control commission. He said the process is that there is almost no revocation with several situations occurring within a one year period; it becomes a protected property right and is fairly complicated.

Board members indicated that it's a nice facility and a great idea but they were concerned with their ability to control it. Chief Somerville discussed some of his concerns and said that he was happy to see the surveillance equipment and that he expected full cooperation from owner. He said that gang activity would not be tolerated. The area being near the unincorporated jurisdiction may create some issues due to the origin of the sound being in the village jurisdiction. Chief Somerville said the concerns are the same as other alcohol establishments. Board members discussed considering special event liquor licenses for wedding and private party events that may be approved on a monthly basis. Mr. Georgiades said that was the original plan but the ordinance only allows for 4 special events per year. He said he would have no problem with this concept if the ordinance could be changed to 4 special event permits per week.

Mr. John Heden, Antioch Hills subdivision read his statement outlining their homeowner's association's research regarding Club Energy. He identified potential issues including traffic, parking, noise and accountability. He said a committee has been put into place and he discussed concerns regarding the liquor license. He said regardless of the reason for business purpose, concerned with the direction liquor license may lead as result of business plan change. He also said that he appreciated everything the petitioner has done to communicate with residents and he hopes they continue with a family environment venue.

Rich Martin, who lives next door to Club Energy, said that recently the pictures on the walls in house were vibrating, all his windows were closed, the air conditioning was on and he could hear base. He said that a neighbor who lives behind him also heard similar noise on another occasion. Mr. Geveleca said that he spoke to one of the petitioners earlier in the day to let him about the situation. Mr. Georgiades said they were doing sound checks with the new system and although not sure, the doors may have been open during that time. He said they would look into the situation.

Board members said they believed the petitioners have the best intentions with their business plan, but they still had concerns regarding the general welfare of the community with so many unknown factors. They expressed concerns regarding the alcohol aspect to the plan.

Mayor Hanson said there are a lot of concerns regarding the liquor license; they want a teen /family center but ultimately felt this would evolve to a full liquor license. He said the petitioner mad a large investment and he sees all concerns. He also said the petitioners have been upfront and they may have every intention to do everything right, but if it fails, the next guy may not. Mayor Hanson said he didn't feel the police costs was as much of a concern as wondering if this business is right for teen center and he discussed earlier conversations with the petitioner at the beginning of the process when they proposed only a teen center.

Trustee Dominiak moved, seconded by Trustee Sakas to grant a special use permit for 23 arcade devices for PZB 11-02, with the conditions included within the Chairman's letter of recommendation and have an approving resolution drafted for the June 20, 2011 meeting. Upon roll call, the vote was:

YES: 6: Pierce, Sakas, Poulos, Crosby, Dominiak and Jozwiak.

Trustee Sakas moved, seconded by Trustee Jozwiak to table discussion regarding the liquor license request for PZB 11-02 to the July 13, 2011 Committee of the Whole meeting. Upon roll call, the vote was:

14. Consideration of an Agreement between the Village of Antioch and Illinois
Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council for a two year term starting May 1, 2011 – Administrator
Keim reported that negotiations began in March 2011 with the FOP for the Police Officers labor
agreement. A tentative agreement was reached on all items on May 25, 2011 and the Illinois Fraternal
Order of Police Labor Council unanimously ratified the agreement on June 1, 2011. Administrator Keim
also reviewed the summary of negotiated modifications dated May 25, 2011.

Trustee Pierce moved, seconded by Trustee Jozwiak to approve in substantial conformance the Agreement between the Village of Antioch and Illinois Fraternal Order of Police Labor Council for a two year term starting May 1, 2011 and ending April 30, 2013. Upon roll call, the vote was:

YES: 6: Pierce, Sakas, Poulos, Crosby, Dominiak and Jozwiak.

VIII. ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Administrator Keim reported the Railroad Crossing on North Avenue will be closed on June 7, 2011. He said the crossing is expected to be closed for five days.

X. TRUSTEE REPORTS

Trustee Jozwiak said the final preparations were being done on the community garden. He also said the pool is ready for the season and that public works department created a printed work order process that is working really well.

Trustee Dominiak reported that she attended the Antioch Senior Council meeting earlier today. She also asked about the number of empty homes or high grass and the possibility of placing notices on the website and newsletter as a way for residents to report these areas of concern. Mayor Hanson said the neighborhood watch group created a task force to help report these circumstances. Administrator Keim encouraged everyone to use the process already in place and use the request for service feature on the Village's website. This feature assigns the situation to the proper department and has tracking ability.

Trustee Crosby said that he noticed there tag day group at the intersection of Route 173 and Deep Lake Road. He discussed his concerns regarding safety and said the tag day policy will be discussed at the June 15, 2011 Committee of the Whole meeting.

Trustee Poulos said he met with Finance Director McCarthy earlier today and they will be talking about some issues at the June 15, 2011 Committee of the Whole meeting. He also discussed the CLC golf outing event that raised \$1500 toward the Corporal Peck fund.

Trustee Sakas said they are conducting candidate interviews for the Planning and Zoning Commission. Trustee Sakas will not be able to attend the June 15, 2011 meeting.

Trustee Pierce said that he heard a lot of positive comments regarding the Summer Wine Walk event. Mayor Hanson said the parks department staff did a tremendous job on the wine walk and turned this into a very nice event. He said Special Events Coordinator Roby should be commended for his doing a fantastic job with this event. Trustee Pierce also discussed the Memorial Day event that was held at the Antioch VFW. He also asked for an update on the towing policy with Chief Somerville responding that he would send a report.

<u>SUBJECT</u>: Consideration of a Resolution for Participation in the Lake County Multi-Jurisdiction All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The FEMA Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 provides the legal basis for FEMA mitigation planning requirements for State, local and Indian Tribal governments as a condition of mitigation grant assistance. The Disaster Mitigation Act amended the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act by repealing the previous mitigation planning provisions and replacing them with a new set of requirements that emphasize the need for State, local, and Indian Tribal entities to closely coordinate mitigation planning and implementation efforts. The requirement for a State mitigation plan is continued as a condition of disaster assistance, adding incentives for increased coordination and integration of mitigation activities at the State level through the establishment of requirements for two different levels of state plans. The Disaster Mitigation Act also established a new requirement for local mitigation plans.

Because of the elevated costs and time commitments necessary to create, maintain and revise the All Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan, counties were allowed to prepare and adopt the plans and municipalities would become compliant by participating in the preparation, planning, maintenance, revisions and adoption of the plan.

On December 18, 2006, the Resolution No. 06-16 Adoption of the Lake County Multi-Jurisdiction All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan was adopted by the Board of Trustees. At this time the ANHMP is being reviewed and revised. Village staff have participated in this process to date.

The benefit to the Village of Antioch is that we are then eligible for Hazard Mitigation Grant Programs and Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grants. In addition, the AHNMP provides valuable information that is used to revise and maintain our Village Emergency Operations Plan.

The time commitment for participation is minimal. During the plan revision year there are three planning meetings (one per month – May, June, July). Two presentations to the Village Board – one for continued participation and one for the adoption of the revised plan.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The implementation of the proposed ordinance opens the door for State and Federal Grants that will allow for the purchase of operating equipment, training materials, and communications equipment that can be utilized by all of the emergency service departments.

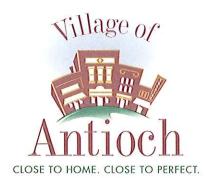

RESOLUTION NO. 06-16

ADOPTION OF THE LAKE COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTION ALL NATURAL HAZARDS MITIGATION PLAN

WHEREAS, one of the most important missions of Lake County is to protect the life and health of safety of the residents of the County; and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Lake County Emergency Management Agency includes the charge to identify hazards and vulnerabilities, whether natural or man made, within the corporate limits of Lake County, and provide programs to eliminate or reduce the affects of such threats; and

WHEREAS, the Mission of the Lake County Stormwater Management Commission includes the charge to identify flood hazards and vulnerabilities within the corporate limits of the County and municipalities, and provide programs to eliminate or reduce the affects of flood damage; and

WHEREAS, a Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan is required for Lake County to receive any state or federal mitigation funding such as flood prone buy-outs or improvements; and

WHEREAS, Lake County is subject to flooding, tornadoes, winter storms and other natural hazards that can damage properties, close businesses, disrupt traffic and present a public health and safety hazard; and

WHEREAS, Lake County All Natural Hazards Mitigation Planning Committee, comprised of representatives of the County, municipalities and stakeholders organizations, has prepared a recommended All Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan that reviews options to reduce damage and protect people from the identified hazards; and

WHEREAS, the recommended All Natural Mitigation plan has been widely circulated for review by the County's residents and federal, state and regional agencies and has been supported by those reviewers.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Village of Antioch that:

- 1. The All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Village of Antioch.
- 2. The Mitigation Planning Committee is hereby established as a permanent advisory body. It shall be composed of the following representative or designee, as appointed by the Mayor and approved by the Village Board of Trustees:
 - a. The Director of Emergency Management.
 - b. Those municipalities that pass a resolution to adopt the All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan send a representative to attend the meetings of the committee.

- c. Representatives of other interested agencies, organizations and associations appointed by the Chair of the County Board to represent stakeholders in hazard mitigation and the general public.
- 3. The Committee shall meet as often as necessary to prepare or review mitigation activities and progress toward implementing the *All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan*. It shall meet at least once each year to review the status of ongoing projects.
- 4. The schedule of the Committee meetings shall be posted in appropriate places. All meetings of the Committee shall be open to the public.
- 5. By _____ of each year, the committee shall prepare an annual evaluation report on the *All Natural Hazards Mitigation Plan* for the County Board and the member municipalities. The report will cover the following points:
 - a. A review of the original plan.
 - b. A review of any natural disasters that have occurred the previous year.
 - c. A review of the action items in the original plan, including any accomplishments of the previous year.
 - d. A discussion of why any action items scheduled for completion the previous year were not completed or why implementation is behind schedule.
 - e. Recommendation of new projects revised schedules or revised actions, subject to review and approval by the County Board and/or affected municipalities governing boards as amendments to the previously adopted plan.
- 6. The director of each County office identified as "responsible party" for the *Mitigation Plan's* action items shall ensure that the action item is implemented by the listed deadline, subject to fiscal and time constraints, including federal and state funding, where appropriate.
- 7. The County Administrator's Office, the Emergency Management Agency and the Stormwater Management Commission shall provide staff support for the Committee's work.

SUBJECT: Consideration of a Resolution Amending the Established Policy for Street Sales

and "Tag Day" Events.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The current Village Code Section 4-7-5 states that, "Charitable organizations wishing to establish a tag day solicitation within the village shall request the same from the village board of trustees".

Tag Day events were discussed by the Village Board at regular and committee meetings held in October, 2009 and January, 2010. At the June 15, 2011 committee meeting, Board members discussed additional safety concerns in certain locations, such as legs of intersections close to a railroad crossing and busy intersections such as Route 83 and Route 173. It was the consensus of the Board to amend the policy addressing these concerns immediately and contact previously approved organizations notifying them of any changes to their request.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-XX

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ESTABLISHED POLICY FOR STREET SALES AND "TAG DAY" EVENTS

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities are responsible to take appropriate action to regulate the use of the public streets, and

WHEREAS, the Village has historically allowed local non-profit groups to have representatives stand in the roadways collecting funds for charitable causes or charitable organizations, and

WHEREAS, the Village has experienced a growth in the number of such requests and staff has noted that many of these requests come from organizations that are located far from Antioch and which do not directly serve the needs of the citizens of this Village, and

WHEREAS, the growth of the Village in recent years, along with other growth in nearby communities and unincorporated areas has resulted in increasing congestion on area roadways and has required much road construction, and

WHEREAS, the Village has never had a formal policy to deal with street sales and "tag day" requests, but has dealt with them on a more or less informal and ad hoc basis, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board is keenly aware of the imposition upon the public that can be caused by street sales and "tag day" events and wishes to balance the important social goals of securing support for worthy charitable organizations and the needs of the public to congestion-free streets and free-flowing traffic, and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities have duly considered the above responsibilities and wish to establish a limit on the overall number of sanctioned events, to more clearly define what types of organizations may be allowed to use the public ways in this fashion and to ensure the safety of drivers and persons in the roadway to the maximum extent possible,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: This policy shall apply to all street sales and "tag day" events occurring hereafter.

SECTION TWO: Notwithstanding any provision hereof, in the event the Chief of Police or his or her duly authorized designee shall deem a particular event covered herein to constitute a hazard to life or limb, the Police Department shall have the power and civic responsibility to terminate the event or to require modifications in place or methods employed, public safety being the paramount concern of the Village. This includes the right to discontinue tag operations at locations due to observed congestion or backups resulting at rail crossings or intersections.

SECTION THREE: Commencing immediately upon passage of this Resolution, the Village Administrator shall approve or reject any application from any charitable group for a license to conduct a street sale or "tag day event". The Village Administrator shall have the final authority to establish the application and review process on whatever forms appear to him or her to be necessary or helpful. The final decision of the Village Administrator may be appealed to the Village Board by a written petition filed within 10 days of his or her decision, and in the absence of such an appeal, the decision of the Village Administrator shall be deemed to be final for all intents and purposes. Any appeal shall be considered by the Village Board at the next reasonably convenient regular meeting

and the declined applicant shall be given the opportunity to present written or verbal evidence or statements in support of its application.

SECTION FOUR: The following specific regulations shall apply to all street sales and "tag day" events that are duly licensed in accordance herewith:

- A. Only charitable organizations that are recognized as tax exempt entities by the IRS (ie. so-called 501(c) (3) entities and religious organizations) shall be eligible for licenses and the applicants shall bear the burden of proving that they are so eligible.
- B. There shall be no street sales or solicitations of any kind in or adjacent to road construction zones.
- C. The Village Administrator may limit sales to specific streets, intersections and directional traffic lanes in streets as necessary to maximize public safety and ease congestion.
- D. There shall not be more than two licenses granted per month during the period from April through November in any calendar year.
- E. No license shall be granted for a period of more than two (2) days' duration, and all licenses shall be granted solely for weekends, ie., Saturday and Sunday.
- F. All applications for licenses shall be submitted by the end of February in any calendar year.
- G. The specific weekends which are available for street sales and "tag day" events shall be scheduled a designated annually by the Village Board in a regular meeting in the first quarter of the calendar year.
- H. In setting the annual calendar, the Village Board shall not designate more than ten (10) weekends for street sales and "tag day" events, and shall avoid scheduling any such events on holiday weekends.
- I. No license shall be granted to any organization that is neither located physically within a fifteen (15) mile radius of the Antioch Village Hall or which does not directly provide a reasonable range of charitable services to citizens residing within the Village of Antioch. The burden shall be on the applicant located distantly to demonstrate that it does in fact provide a reasonable range of charitable services to Antioch citizens.
- J. No license or solicitation shall be allowed at the following intersections. Illinois State Route 173 and Deep Lake Road, Illinois State Route 173 and Illinois State Route 83, Illinois State Route 173, and Illinois State Route 59.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon passage and retroactive for events scheduled for calendar year 2011.

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

The Village Code Section 10-15-5, outlines the procedures for applying and considering special use requests within the Village. The applicants John Tsichlis and Peter Georgiades have requested approvals for a Liquor License and 23 Arcade Devices pursuant to the Village Code in association with the operation of Club Energy.

The Combined Planning Commission and Zoning Board conducted a public hearing on January 13, 2011, February 10, 2011, March 10, 2011, and concluded on April 14, 2011 following notification as required by State Law and Village Ordinance to consider a petition for a Special Use Approval allowing more than 10 amusement devices in a B-1 Zone and a Special Use Approval for a liquor license.

Based upon its findings, the positive recommendation is forwarded to the Village Board for the final action.

ORDINANCE NO. 11-xx-xx AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR 23 AMUSEMENT DEVICES IN A B-1 ZONE UPON THE PETITION OF CLUB ENERGY (PZB-11-02)

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 15 of Title 10 of the Antioch Village Code, a public hearing was commenced by the Combined Planning Commission and Zoning Board on January 13, 2011, February 10, 2011, March 10, 2011, and concluded on April 14, 2011 following notification as required by State Law and Village Ordinance to consider a petition for a Special Use Approval allowing more than 10 amusement devices in a B-1 Zone after due notice by newspaper publication, pursuant to the application of John Tsichlis and Peter Georgiades ("Owner"), at the property commonly known as 1350 Illinois Route 83, Antioch, Illinois, and

WHEREAS, the Combined Planning Commission recommended approval to the Village Board to allow the devices; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have concluded and found that the Special Use, subject to and in conformance with the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, is necessary or desirable to provide a service or a facility which is in the interest of public convenience, will contribute to the general welfare of the neighborhood or community, and will not, under the circumstances of this particular case, be detrimental to the health, safety, morals or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity, or injurious to property values or improvements in the vicinity; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have concluded and found that the Special Use will further the development of the Subject Property, and will otherwise enhance and promote the general welfare of the Village and the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ANTIOCH, LAKE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION I</u>: The representations, recitations and findings set forth in the foregoing recitals are material to this Ordinance and such recitals are hereby incorporated into and made a part of this Ordinance as though they were fully set forth herein. This Ordinance shall be liberally construed so that the purpose and intent represented by the recitals shall be accomplished to the greatest extent permitted by law.

<u>SECTION II</u>: That the real estate which is the subject of this ordinance (Subject Property) is legally described as follows:

Legal Description: Lots 105, 106, 107, 108, and 109 in Antioch Hills, being a Subdivision of part of the West ½ of Section 17, Township 46 North, Range 10, East of the Third Principal Meridian, according to the Plat thereof October 2, 1924 as Document 246684, in Book "M" of Plats, Page 94, in Lake County, Illinois

<u>SECTION III:</u> That, subject to the conditions stated below, the Special Use shall be and is hereby approved and shall be binding upon the Village, Petitioner and Owner, and their respective owners successors, and assigns when a true execution copy of this Ordinance is tendered to the Village fully executed by the Petitioner and Owner, and when the Mayor has affixed his signature upon the Ordinance.

SECTION IV: That the Special Use granted herein shall be subject to the following conditions on the design and operation of the Facility:

- A. Friday and Saturday nights, where the operation is geared toward teens, no one under 15 is allowed without parent or guardian.
- B. Those patrons 17 and under shall be wrist banded and marked to remain in compliance with section 6-3-1 of the Village Code which states:

It is unlawful for a person less than seventeen (17) years of age to be present at or upon any public assembly, building, place, street or highway at the following times unless accompanied and supervised by a parent, legal guardian or other responsible companion at least eighteen (18) years of age approved by a parent or legal guardian or unless engaged in a business or occupation which the laws of this state authorize a person less than seventeen (17) years of age to perform:

Between 12:01 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. Saturday; Between 12:01 A.M. and 6:00 A.M. Sunday; and Between 11:00 P.M. on Sunday to Thursday, inclusive, and 6:00 A.M. on the following day.

- C. The operation will include 10 on site security guards;
- D. The operation will include a 25 camera security system
- E. The Applicant will provide the Village the executed contract for 30 parking spaces at 1326 Route 83.

<u>SECTION V:</u> The following exhibits shall be attached to and made a part of this Special Use Ordinance and, except as expressly modified by this Ordinance, compliance with all standards, requirements, designs or specifications in such exhibits shall be a condition of the grant of this Special Use Ordinance:

- A. Staff Reports and Letter of Recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Chairmen, attached as Exhibit A;
- B. Business Plan and Exhibit Prepared by Club Energy as Exhibit B.

SECTION VI: Any person violating the terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) with each and every day that the violation of the Ordinance is allowed to remain in effect being deemed a complete and separate offense. In addition, the appropriate authorities of the Village may take such other action as they deem proper to enforce the terms and conditions of this Ordinance, including, without limitation, an action in equity to compel compliance with its terms. Any person violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be subject, in addition to the foregoing penalties, to the payment of court costs and reasonable attorneys' fees. This section shall not apply to the Village of Antioch, its officials, agents or employees.

SECTION VII: If any provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this ordinance or application thereof to any person, firm, corporation, public agency or circumstance, shall, for any reason, be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, said judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this ordinance and the application of such provision to other persons, firms, corporation, or circumstances, but shall be confined in its operation to the provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and to the person, firm, corporation, or circumstances involved. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent of the corporate authorities that this ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional or invalid provision, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof not been included.

SECTION VIII: That the Village Clerk is hereby directed and ordered to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form as provided by law.

SECTION IX: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

<u>SUBJECT</u>: Consideration of an Ordinance Establishing Chapter 7-1A of the Municipal Code of Antioch Regulating the Use of Mobile Telephones by Drivers of Vehicles

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

At the June 15, 2011 Committee of the Whole Meeting, the Village Board discussed an ordinance regulating the use of mobile telephones by drivers of vehicles. Those present discussed the increased dangers of distracted driving, and the need for regulation in order to preserve public safety. They agreed that enforcement of the ordinance should be gradual with a 90-day grace period, and emphasis should be placed on public safety rather than to generate revenue.

The Ordinance provides that no person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a mobile telephone except while using a hands-free device, or while maintaining the vehicle in a stationary and parked position with the transmission in park or neutral, and except when using the mobile telephone to call 911 or other emergency agencies in order to contact public safety forces.

ORDINANCE	11 -	

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING CHAPTER 7-1A OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ANTIOCH REGULATING USE OF MOBILE TELEPHONES BY DRIVERS OF VEHICLES

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that use of mobile telephone communication devices, commonly known as cell phones, while driving constitute significant distractions generally, but much moreso when the cell phones are operated without the use of a "hands free" device such as an earbud or speaker, and

WHEREAS, the use of cell phones in vehicles by drivers is regulated in part, but not completely by the State of Illinois in sections 625 ILCS 5/12-610.1 and 625 ILCS 5/12-610.2, and

WHEREAS, violations of the two statutory sections cited hereinabove are reportable to the Secretary of State as moving violations that can accumulate to result in suspension or revocation of one's driving license, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that technology has advanced to the point where hands free devices are commonly available and inexpensive, often coming free with cell phones, and that mandating use of such devices as a means of limiting the distraction of drivers and improving the public safety while still allowing use of cell phones while driving strikes a reasonable balance between the competing rights of communication and freedom from unreasonable danger on the road, and

WHEREAS, the federal courts in Illinois have found that laws restricting the use of cell phones by drivers without hands free devices are consonant with the Constitution and are permissible under federal law (see, e.g., *Schor v. Daley*, 563 F. Supp. 2d 893),

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Chapter 7-1A of the Antioch Municipal Code is hereby established and it shall hereafter read as follows:

CHAPTER 1A MOBILE TELEPHONE RESTRICTIONS

- 7-1A-1 DEFINITIONS: For the purposes of this Section, the following terms shall be applicable:
- 1. "Hands-free device" shall mean a device that either:

- a. is external to a mobile telephone, and which allows the user to communicate verbally through the telephone without touching the telephone, or
- b. is an internal speaker/microphone which allows the user to communicate verbally through the telephone without touching the telephone.
- 2. "Mobile telephone" shall mean a cellular, analog, wireless or digital telephone capable of sending or receiving telephonic communications via radio waves.
- 3. "On-board communications device" shall mean a communication system or device that is hard-wired into a motor vehicle.
- 4. "Use" shall mean communicating verbally through a mobile telephone.
- 7-1A-2 PROHIBITION: Except as otherwise provided for in 7-1A-3 of this Code, no person shall operate a motor vehicle while using a mobile telephone.
- 7-1A-3 EXCEPTIONS: The prohibition provided for in 7-1A-2 of this Code shall not apply to the following:
 - 1. Any person using a hands-free device for voice communication, provided that that person does not touch the mobile telephone through which that device functions while operating or using the vehicle;
 - 2. Any person using a mobile telephone to call 911 or other emergency telephone number to contact public safety forces;
 - 3. Any person using a mobile telephone while maintaining a motor vehicle in a stationary and parked position with the transmission in park or neutral.

7-1A-4 PENALTY:

- 1. Whoever violates any provision of this chapter shall be fined as provided in the schedule of fines set forth in section 1-3-1A of this code for each offense.
- 2. Whoever violates any provision of this chapter and such violation occurs during a vehicular collision shall be fined as provided in the schedule of fines set forth in section 1-3-1A of this code for each such offense.

SECTION TWO: Section 1-3-1A of the Antioch Municipal Code is hereby amended by the addition of the following line items which shall hereafter read as follows:

SUBJECT: Consideration of an Ordinance Amending the Fines for Alcohol Consumption by a Minor

and Social Hosting

SUMMARY AND BACKGROUND OF SUBJECT MATTER:

Recently, following a series of arrests at an underage drinking party in the Clublands subdivision, a large crowd of teenagers was clogging traffic court. The Police Department command staff has expressed serious concern over this use of the courts, and whether it's really appropriate to take teenagers directly into the circuit court system on first time offenses of this nature. Many of the kids came from good families and the punishment did not seem to appropriately fit the crime. Command staff liked the idea of using the Adjudication Court for cases of this nature since the kids wouldn't be forced to miss school, their parents could be more directly involved and if the nature of arrests warranted it, we would still have the circuit court as our backup.

Staff brought this to the Village Attorney, who approved the basic concept. He then reviewed the list of offenses directed to the adjudication court and found that this list hadn't been updated to coincide with the new liquor ordinance. This resulted in the attached draft ordinance and adjudication court list. All changes in the list relate to the liquor ordinance and are either to send minor drinkers to the adjudication court, or to coordinate the adjudication court eligible offenses with the section numbering in the new liquor code. The suggested amendment was reviewed and approved at the May 16, 2011 meeting.

Following approval, staff reviewed the fines for minor alcohol consumption and social hosting and recommended amending these fines to be in line with other jurisdictions.

WHEREAS, the Village Board established an adjudication court system in Ordinance 10-04-09, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board subsequently adopted a completely revised liquor code, which resulted in a significant number of new provisions and completely renumbered the code scheme, and

WHEREAS, the adjudication court schedule needs to be updated to include the correct numbers for the code sections of the revised liquor code and the provision therein of the new provisions that are amenable to resolution through the adjudication court system,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE: Section 1-3-1A of the Antioch Municipal Code is hereby amended by the substitution of the section of the chart entitled "Liquor Control" with the chart set forth on Exhibit A hereto.

SECTION TWO: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.

Re: Amendment to Adjudication Ordinance

Recently, following a series of arrests at an underage drinking party in the Clublands subdivision, a large crowd of teenagers was clogging traffic court. The Police Department command staff has expressed serious concern over this use of the courts, and whether it's really appropriate to take teenagers directly into the circuit court system on first time offenses of this nature. Many of the kids came from good families and the punishment did not seem to appropriately fit the crime. Command staff liked the idea of using the Adjudication Court for cases of this nature since the kids wouldn't be forced to miss school, their parents could be more directly involved and if the nature of arrests warranted it, we would still have the circuit court as our backup.

Staff brought this to the Village Attorney, who approved the basic concept. He then reviewed the list of offenses directed to the adjudication court and found that this list hadn't been updated to coincide with the new liquor ordinance. This resulted in the attached draft ordinance and adjudication court list. All changes in the list relate to the liquor ordinance and are either to send minor drinkers to the adjudication court, or to coordinate the adjudication court eligible offenses with the section numbering in the new liquor code. The suggested amendment was reviewed and approved at the May 16, 2011 meeting.

Following approval, staff reviewed the fines for minor alcohol consumption and social hosting and recommended amending these fines to be in line with other jurisdictions.

Attached is the fine scheduled amending Section 4-2C-13 through 4-2C-15.
