#### **ORDINANCE 16-11-32**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4-2B-10 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ANTIOCH ADDING BYOB LICENSE REGULATIONS FOR NON-RESTAURANT ESTABLISHMENTS

WHEREAS, the Village Board has been petitioned by the building owners of 391 Lake Street in Antioch seeking to allow the consumption of beer or wine in a non-restaurant establishment in order to gain a tenant for a proposed art studio in the downtown area, and

WHEREAS, the potential tenant wishes to offer painting classes in an environment that will allow their users to bring in outside beer or wine during the class, and

WHEREAS, currently, the Village Code only allows for a permit to allow wine to be brought onto the premises of a restaurant with proper licensing, not other non-restaurant facilities, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has considered the request and has determined that the proposal is appropriate for the suggested location and type of business, and that regulations be put in place to allow, license and regulate BYOB establishments, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board wishes to expand business opportunities wherever possible, for the overall benefit of the citizens and taxpayers of this Village, and

WHEREAS, this particular proposal appears to be a highly attractive amenity being added to the assets of the Village, which should assist the Village Board in improving the overall marketability of the Village and in attracting additional tourists and hotel guests,

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

**SECTION ONE:** Section 4-2B-10 of the Antioch Municipal Code is hereby amended by adding paragraph "J" which shall hereafter read as follows (additions <u>underlined</u>, deletions <u>stricken</u>):

# J. Class J: Non-Restaurant BYOB License. 1. License required: No person shall allow alcohol to be carried in for consumption on the premises of an establishment without first having a BYOB license from the Village of Antioch.

- 2. Application Requirements: Applications for such a license shall be made in writing, to the mayor, and shall contain the following information:
- a. The name, age and address of the applicant in the case of an individual; if a corporation, the name and address of the duly authorized agent who signed the application.

- b. The name, location and a description of the premises or place of business which is to be operated with a permit authorized pursuant to this section. c. A letter from the property owner (if different than the applicant) granting permission to obtain such a license for the premises. d. A certificate of insurance reflecting a policy in force for the full period for which the license is to be issued that provides general liability coverage in the amounts of at least one million dollars for injury or death (combined single limits). e. Acknowledgement that the applicant agrees to save and hold harmless the Village of Antioch from any and all claims arising out of consumption of alcoholic liquor on the premises, and that the applicant will follow the Village of Antioch Liquor Control Ordinance, including the prohibition against allowing minors to consume and the hours of consumption. f. Each application shall be reviewed by the Village Board of Trustees and either approved or denied by a majority vote. 3. License Terms: In addition to the terms and conditions stated in Section 4-2C of the Village Code, all non-restaurant BYOB licenses shall be subject to the following: a. The license holder shall not allow any alcoholic beverages other than wine or beer to be consumed on the licensed premises. b. No licenses, nor any employee or staff member of the licenses is permitted to open and pour the wine or beer. c. No storage of beer or wine is permitted.
- **SECTION TWO:** Section 4-2B-11 of the Antioch Municipal Code is hereby amended by the addition to the following paragraph 2, which shall hereafter read as follows:
