Ordinance No. 21-07-20

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 4, CHAPTER 4 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF ANTIOCH REGARDING PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS

WHEREAS, the Village of Antioch ("Village") is an Illinois non-home rule municipality organized and operating under the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/1, et seq.) (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Village Board of Trustees (the "Village Board", and together with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to the efficient operation of government; and

WHEREAS, Title 4, Chapter 4 of the Municipal Code of Antioch (the "Village Code") regulates peddlers and solicitors; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the regulations regarding peddlers and solicitors need to be updated; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable, and in the best interests of the Village, and its residents, to amend Title 4, Chapter 4 of the Village Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: The Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution, or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Title 4, Chapter 4 of the Village Code as set forth below (additions <u>underlined</u>; deletions <u>stricken</u>):

4-4-2: LICENSE REQUIREMENTS:

- A. License Required: Every person who desires to operate as a salesperson, peddler or solicitor shall procure a license therefor before engaging in such work. (1976 Code § 116.061)
- B. Application For License:
 - 1. Every person desiring such license shall make application in writing therefor to the village clerk during regular hours giving full information as may be required upon the application blank, to be furnished by the village clerk, and shall state the full name, residence, age, type of work the applicant expects to engage in, for whom the applicant is selling and a character reference. The applicant shall deposit a license fee as required for the particular form of license issued. A certificate of insurance shall be submitted to the village at the time of application. Said liability insurance shall have minimum coverage limits of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) general aggregate.
 - 2. Before said license shall be issued, such applicant must go to the police department of the village giving the same information to said department, and said department

shall record the fingerprints of each applicant together with the photograph to be furnished by such applicant. No license shall be issued before the expiration of three (3) days, unless the police department shall sooner be able to check the character, qualifications and record of such applicant. If same is found to be in proper order, the department shall then approve a card, to be furnished by the village clerk, bearing a photograph of the applicant similar to the one on file in the police department, such license shall be signed by the village clerk and the chief of police of the village. (1976 Code § 116.062; and 2003 Code)

C. Fees:

- 1. At the time of the filing of the application, a fee of five dollars (\$5.00) shall be paid to the village clerk to cover the cost of the investigation.
- 2. The license fee for <u>salespersons</u>, peddlers, <u>and solicitors</u> shall be as follows: <u>two hundred</u> fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day for each applicant. (1976 Code § 116.063)
- D. Investigations: The chief of police may make such investigation of each and every applicant as they may deem proper and if, in his their opinion a longer time than is provided for in this chapter is required, they shall be at liberty to refuse to issue such license until such investigation is completed; however, the village shall act to approve or deny any application within twenty one (21) days of the date of receipt of application.
- <u>SECTION 2</u>: The Village Code is hereby amended, notwithstanding any provision, ordinance, resolution, or Village Code section to the contrary, by amending Title 4, Chapter 4 of the Village Code by inserting Section 4-4-5 as set forth below (additions <u>underlined</u>):

4-4-5: PENALTY:

Whoever violates any provision of this chapter shall be fined \$500.00 for each offense. Each day's violation shall be deemed a separate offense.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: The Corporate Authorities hereby approve the amendments of Title 4, Chapter 4 of the Village Code.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: All ordinances, resolutions and orders or parts of ordinances, resolutions and orders in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: The Village Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form.

<u>SECTION 6</u>: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days after passage and publication as provided by law.
