**ORDINANCE 21-10-38**

**AN ORDINANCE ADDING ONE MORE CLASS "A" and "A-1" RESTAURANT LIQUOR LICENSE FOR STATION 51 TRUCK COMPANY BAR AND GRILL, INC TO BE LOCATED AT 883 N. MAIN STREET**

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board has been petitioned by Kristopher Schoenberger who has requested a liquor license for his corporation Station 51 Truck Company Bar & Grill, Inc. at 883 N. Main Street, and in particular, who has asked that they be granted an additional Class "A" and "A-1" liquor license which will allow him a full service restaurant license provided the sale of food comprises at least 40% of the annual gross revenues of the restaurant, and

**WHEREAS**, the applicant has previously presented the business plan for the restaurant to the Village Board, and has received incentive funds from the Village for the proposed new restaurant, expected to bring vitality and business into Downtown Antioch, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board has found and determined that the sale of food and drink at this establishment will certainly exceed 50% of sales revenues, when considering the potential sales volume of any and all other merchandise or revenues reasonably projected from operations at the establishment, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board has considered the application and has determined that the proposal is appropriate for the suggested location and type of business, and it is an appropriate designated licensee based on the proposal and other licenses held, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Board wishes to expand business and cultural opportunities wherever possible, for the overall benefit of the citizens and taxpayers of this Village,

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Village of Antioch, Lake County, Illinois, as follows:


**SECTION ONE:** The Village Clerk, acting as the Secretary of the Local Liquor Commissioner is directed to revise the chart of allowed liquor licenses to increase the number of Class "A" and "A-1" licenses by 1 effective at such time Station 51 Truck Company Bar & Grill, Inc. has secured a certificate of occupancy for the business and qualifies for a Village of Antioch Liquor License.

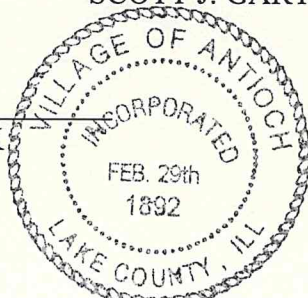
**SECTION TWO:** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as required by law.


**CERTIFICATE**
