VILLAGE OF ANTIOCH BOARD OF TRUSTEES, PUBLIC HEARING Municipal Building: 874 Main Street, Antioch, IL December 18, 2006

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Larson called the December 18, 2006 public hearing regarding the Tax Levy Ordinance to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building: 874 Main Street, Antioch, IL.

ROLL CALL

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, roll call indicated the following Trustees were present: McCarty, Caulfield, and Porch. Also present were Mayor Larson, Administrator Haley, Attorney Magna and Clerk Rowe. Absent: Trustees Hanson, Pierce and Turner.

PUBLIC NOTICE AND OATH

Clerk Rowe read aloud the published public notice regarding the proposed property tax increase for the Village of Antioch and administered the oath to those who wished to testify.

Administrator Haley

Administrator Haley said that we have this public hearing every year and the wording in the notice is required by statute. He explained that we are under the property tax extension limitation law which states we can only increase the levy by the consumer price index or 5% whichever is less, plus the new equalized assessed evaluation. He said the Lake County tax extension office is using 3.4% CPI this year and the new construction equalized evaluation as indicated by our building permits is \$29,604,813. Mr. Haley said this amount is less than last year's \$67,000,000 and the Board can see the slow down in building is affecting us. Mr. Haley also reviewed Section Two of the public notice states the corporate and special purpose property taxes extended for 2005 were \$2,303,594.13. He explained that corporate taxes are those that can be defined as our general fund; funds to be used for a variety of municipal functions. The special purpose taxes are levied for specific purposes such as police pension, street and bridge, fire protection, emergency management, audit and the like. Mr. Haley said that Section Two states the proposed corporate and special purpose property taxes to be levied this year are \$3,107,226 and represents a 34.89% increase over the previous year. Administrator Haley said this is not a 34.89% increase in anyone's individual property tax. He said it's a percentage increase of the total taxes levied in the village this year over last year. He said when you take into consideration the EAV from the previous year and the depreciation established by Lake County tax extension department it comes up to that amount of money. Mr. Haley said that Section Three indicates that the property taxes extended for debt service in 2005 were \$401,486 and this year it is \$380,921 which is a decrease of 5.12% because our debt has gone down. Mr. Haley said this amount levied is directly relative to the general obligation bond payment requirements that are on file in ordinance form at the Lake County Clerk's office. He said that finally and most important, the review of the tax cap law says that non-home rule governments, of which we are one, in Cook, DuPage, Lake, McHenry and Will Counties are limited to the tax extension increase of 5% or the CPI whichever is less, therefore the maximum that the village portion of an existing property will be only 3.4%. Mr. Haley said the village's portion of the tax bill is less than 20% and most of the property tax goes to education and other taxing districts such as the Lake County Forest Preserve. He said if those different taxing bodies would have a referendum that was passed that would kick in this year, those taxes could go up and the property owner would see an increase of more than the CPI or 5 percent. He said the Village of Antioch, because we have no such referenda, the most it would go up on any given property by law can be 3.4%.

Rewiring new antennas on new tower - Administrator Haley said that as the Board is aware, a new tower is being installed by the fire station and all the police, fire, rescue and emergency management antenna's will be placed on the tower. He reviewed the quotes received for the Village's portion of the cost from Custom Installation & Repair in the amount of \$12,987.36 and from Radicom in the amount of \$9,628.52.

Administrator Haley said the Fire District would be receiving quotes and awarding the bid for their part at their district meeting. Trustee Hanson asked if this work involved removing the antennas from the water tower. Administrator Haley said that was correct and all the equipment would be new.

CITIZENS WISHING TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

David Short, representing the residents of the Woods of Antioch subdivision – Mr. Short reviewed a summary page that was distributed to the Board regarding the Woods of Antioch subdivision and asked the Board what was the status of the acceptance resolution, the inquiry into the Woods of Antioch situation, if this issue would be addressed in upcoming budget meetings and if a comprehensive, long-term solution be achieved.

Scott Frillman, Meridian Way resident – Mr. Scott Frillman, Meridian Way resident discussed the site distance issue at the cross walk at the Tiffany Road and Highview intersection. He asked if it were possible to light the crosswalk because when traveling North on Tiffany Road, the cross walk is visible only at about a 20 foot distance and he feels this is a dangerous situation. Mr. Frillman discussed school traffic when dropping off children the AUGS School and a possible temporary solution to help the school could be to have a crossing guard at Tiffany Road. He also thanked the Village for trimming trees in Tiffany Farms and discussed the Village being proactive in water conservation.

Shannon Rothman, Indian Trail resident – Ms. Rothman, Indian Trail resident, distributed photographs taken on Cameron Drive since the "No Parking or Standing" signs were installed there. She said that she understood the safety issues and concerns but feels the problem would be pushed back to Tiffany Farms Road and asked for a compromise on the no parking on Cameron Drive. Mayor Larson said the Village has been in contact with school officials and are monitoring the situation trying to make it safer for the children going to those schools.

Kathy Nordmeyer, Indian Trail resident – Ms. Nordmeyer, Indian Trail resident, also discussed the traffic situation on Tiffany Farms Road due to no parking being posted on Cameron Drive and felt it's been an ongoing problem since Cameron Drive was opened. She also said that she understood the Board is trying to come up with the best solution. Mayor Larson said that Administrator Haley and Chief Foerster will be monitoring the situation and the Board is trying to come up with the best and safest solution. Trustee McCarty said that he also lives in the area and he discussed cars being parked on the side of the road can cause dangerous blind spots. He also discussed that as parents, we have to educate our children to use and stay on the sidewalks and to use the crosswalks. Ms. Nordmeyer agreed with Trustee McCarty's comments and said the situation on Tiffany Farms Road is also an area of concern and should be addressed.

She said there is a change to schedule adding *Antioch Art Crawl* on May 5 which will be presented by School Districts 34 and 117 and the community service department would assist with the event.

Other Business – Lag Time Fees - Trustee Porch discussed her suggestion of a way the Village can be proactive in helping the schools with their financing. She said we could create an ordinance for "Lag Time Fees" that is being done in other areas of Lake County including Wauconda. Attorney Magna explained that lag time fees are one-time payments by the developers on new residential development that is in addition to the impact fees which cover the period of time between the actual occupancy and the time that the fully improved lot hits the assessment rolls and taxes are collected for the schools based upon their annual tax levy.

Attorney Magna discussed other municipalities who worked with their school districts and adopted a lag time fee ordinance that comes along with annexations and is not added to existing lots.

Trustee Hanson said lag time fee concept has been around a while, and he asked who initiates the fee. Attorney Magna said the experience he had in the other communities was that the school district initiated it and said that it's good if schools in a region can concur. The Village could inquire by meeting with school district business managers. Following discussion, Administrator Haley will contact school officials to set up a meeting with school officials and the finance committee as soon as possible.
